colours.



Well the weather certainly has changed. It looks like summer has well and truly left us.

Grip Leadership excursion

Our year 7 students had the opportunity to attend a GRIP leadership conference. This conference is presented to senior primary and secondary students across Australia. The Adelaide event was presented to hundreds of other year 7 students from the Adelaide region. Topics of discussion were leading the way, generosity and how to make leadership ideas come to life. As usual our students were well behaved and many of our year 7's took the opportunity to be involved and participate in the activities.

NAPLAN Practise Test

NAPLAN testing will begin on 12th of May and conclude on 22nd of May. This testing will be for all year 3, 5 and 7 students. Although this testing is next term, preparing for this event has already begun. Testing this year will be online with the exception of the year 3 writing test which will still be completed on paper. All other 3, 5 and 7 tests will be conducted in the library on a school laptop. More information about the actual testing will be sent home soon.

We will be running a practise test to ensure our system can cope with the NAPLAN process. This will take place Monday 23rd March. This will be a 45 minute test and will simulate test conditions. The test the students take part in will not be marked nor does it go towards their "real" NAPLAN test results.

Not all students will be involved in the practise testing. If your child is selected, they will have the chance to work through some practice questions and see firsthand how the NAPLAN on line testing looks and acts. Students not selected will have a chance to see the testing environment early in term 2.

Information will be sent home shortly about the NAPLAN practise testing and all necessary information about the "real" test will be sent home closer to the date.
